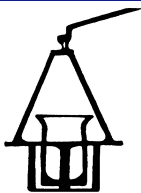

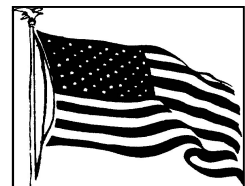

Pastor's Comments

Dear Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the feast of the Blessed Trinity: Father, Son and Holy Spirit, 3 Persons in one God. No one has, nor ever will, understand how this fits together. It is beyond us and we need not spend any time and energy trying how to comprehend how 3 Persons can fit into one.

The thing that we need to think about, however, is that God as Father, Son and Spirit teach us to be relational. It has been said, in trying to understand this phenomenon that the Father and the Son are in a love relationship and that this love between them is the Holy Spirit. Maybe that's a nice way to explain it. The Father and Son need each other and so their shared love in what holds them together.

Every one of us is in relation with each other in the same way. We share this City, State, Country, Earth together. We do not live in isolation with one another, and so everything we do is in relationship. The love, then, that we share with one another is the Spirit of God. The more we love, the more this Spirit is shared with one another.

When we read in Genesis, that God creates the world, He does it in 6 days. God creates the light and the heavens and the earth, rocks, plants, and animals, and He looks at all of these things and says that they are good. God could have stopped there, but none of those things were going to allow God to be in relationship. It wasn't until God creates Adam and Eve that He looks at them and says that "finally I have created something that is like me," namely, one who is created to be in relationship.

God's relationship as Father, Son and Spirit, filters down to us. God wants to be in relationship with us. In fact, He has created us solely for this purpose. It's OK that we enjoy ourselves here on earth. There are a lot of things that we can spend our time doing, but hopefully, they are all done with God present in our minds. God does not just live in Heaven, but is right here among us wanting to share Himself with us.

As Father, Son and Spirit share their love with one another, we are called to follow this

example. We are all called to share this same love with the people around us. It may look like a tall order when we see so much violence, dishonesty, corruption, adultery, around us. But I am reminded of a person walking along a beach one day. The ocean had deposited thousands of little starfish along the sand. He was looking out and marveling at this and then he saw a young man throwing something into the ocean. He walked over and saw that the young man was picking up one starfish at a time and throwing it as far as he could back into the ocean. The man went over and said to the young man, "forget about it. You are never going to be able to throw all of these starfish back into the ocean. What does it matter anyway? They're only starfish." As the young man bent down he picked up another starfish and threw it out into the ocean and said, "It mattered to that one." The young man was saving the starfish one at a time, and maybe it did matter after all.

Well, we matter much more to God than a starfish. God wants so much to be in relationship with us if only we take the time to work with it. All relationships take work, and such is our relationship with God. Like all relationships, our relationship with God is not always going to be a feel good relationship. Sometimes it feels good and sometimes it doesn't, but we must keep trying. By waking up everyday and saying hello to God through prayer, by going out of our way to help another, by quietly appreciating the beauty of the earth around us, we are keeping in good relationship with God, humans and the earth. The Trinity has set the tone. Living in relationship is the only way to make sense of life.

Congratulations to our 7 Confirmation students who celebrated this Sacrament this past week. May God Bless them.
