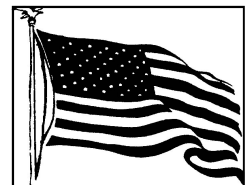

Pastor's Comments

Dear Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the feast of the Body and Blood of Christ. We are reminded today, then, that Jesus offered Himself for us. He offered Himself on the cross, and offered Himself to be shared each and every day at the table of sacrifice, the Eucharist. Each time we come to the Mass we relive what Jesus did at the Last Supper where He took bread, blessed it, broke it and gave it to His apostles as His own body. Jesus in the flesh has come down to us these last 2000 years.

We are so blessed to have this opportunity. Maybe you might even say we are spoiled to be able to partake of the Eucharist everyday if we want. I hope we never lose an appreciation of what this Sacrament does in allowing us to be filled with Jesus. Some may say where is God? And we must say He is right here with us filling us with Himself.

In the gospel today Jesus performs the miracle of the fishes and loaves. There were 5,000 people there and 7 loaves and 2 fish to share with them. Everyone was hungry including Jesus and His disciples. I guess because they were the one's working, they could have said "Why don't we sit down and eat, and these 5,000 people can find food wherever they might." No, Jesus wanted to share what He had with others. This is really the miracle, the sharing with others.

If you go online to www.stopthehunger.com it shows that an estimated 13,631 people are going to die in the world today because of hunger. It is estimated that over 1 billion people in our world are malnourished. This certainly is enough to make one cry. I must say I feel like crying when I go out to dinner and look on the plates of all around and see how much food is wasted when so many millions are starving.

I believe we are spoiled in our eating habits here in this country. Our food portions are way bigger than we need, and there is a lot of waste, but we also may be spoiled in our Eucharist also. I once spent 2 weeks in Nigeria where everyone is poor. They are not all starving, but much poorer than we are. They have learned to live without most of what we think we need in this country, but the people

have a tremendous faith. I can attest to that by celebrating a 6:30am Sunday Mass where 4,000 people attended. Can you imagine 4,000 people up at 6am to go to Mass? One day I was talking to a religious sister who was from Nigeria, but had spent some time in the States going to graduate school, about the differences in the countries. I asked if she found it difficult to live in Nigeria after she had lived in the US. She said that, although the poverty was worse in Nigeria, the faith in Nigeria was much better. People there recognize that they need God. She said she would much prefer living in physical poverty in Nigeria than Spiritual poverty in the US where no one goes to church.

This feast of the Body and Blood of Christ should remind us that we also depend on God. Jesus has shared Himself with us in a way we never could have envisioned. This sacrament should never be taken for granted. I once saw a sign in the sacristy of a church that said to the priest before he said Mass, "Holy priest of God say this Mass as if it were your 1st Mass, Priest of God say this Mass as if it were your last Mass, Priest of God say this Mass as if it were your only Mass." I think that's how we all should approach the Eucharist, as if it were the 1st, last and only time we would ever do it. Maybe that would help us to keep a deeper reverence in our Mass experience.
