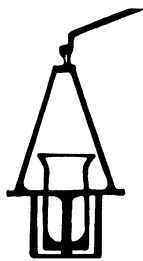

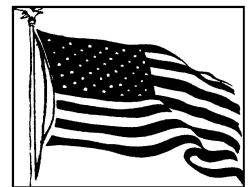

## Pastor's Comments

Dear Parishioners,

**W**e welcome all of our alumni and guests today for Mass and Homecoming. We are very blessed to have you all with us today. This weekend is always a highlight of Redemptorist parish. For those who are coming back to visit, we hope your stay with us will be filled with much happiness. May God's Blessing be with you.

**T**oday's Readings offer us an incredible look into the heart of God's forgiveness. Both the 1<sup>st</sup> Reading from 2<sup>nd</sup> Samuel and the Gospel Reading show the enormity of the love and forgiveness of the Lord God. David was considered the greatest of the Old Testament kings, and yet he was guilty of the greatest of sins. He saw a woman Bathsheba bathing on a rooftop close to his palace and was filled with lust for her. This of course was bad enough, but she was a married woman, and so in order to have his way with her, he had her husband, who was in the military fighting for King David, placed in the center of the battle knowing that he would be killed, which is exactly what happens. This means, effectively, that David, not only was guilty of adultery, but was in fact guilty of murder, the greatest of sins. Nathan the prophet confronts David with his actions, and David falls to the ground and weeps and confesses his sin before God, which God promptly forgives. It is because of David's great humility that he is able to confess his sin to God. This perhaps is his greatest gift. David doesn't deny his sin, he doesn't try to cover it up, he doesn't make excuses. What he has done is terrible, but he admits it and God forgives.

**I**n the Gospel a woman, we don't know her name, is known to be a public sinner. David was guilty of adultery, and then murder. For most people these would be unforgivable sins, things we would scratch our heads at and say "how could anyone do that?" Well this woman is also guilty of some very heavy sins. She is a woman who has slept with countless men in her day. She is a woman that we would turn away from with disgust. She is not the kind of woman that we want to be associated with. She is certainly not the kind of woman that we would invite over for dinner.

**O**f course this is the thinking of the Pharisee, Simon, who has invited Jesus over to dinner. This woman hears that Jesus is in Simon's house and she comes through the door uninvited. Simon is appalled. How could this woman, a terrible sinner, take it upon herself to come to his house uninvited and approach Jesus and touch him? He wants to have her thrown out of his house and call the exterminators to fumigate the whole house and drive out the terrible stench. But like David, although she is a terrible sinner, no one is denying that, her best quality is the fact that she is humble enough to say that she has sinned and to ask for forgiveness, which Jesus promptly gives.

**T**he moral of these stories is that there is no unforgivable sin, but that we must be humble enough to admit that we have made mistakes. That is not always easy. Many times, like Adam and Eve, when we sin we want to cover it up, we want to blame someone else. The sin is bad enough, but when we are confronted with it most of us lie about it. We don't want anyone to know that we are capable of such a thing, but in the end we all are going to know. When we stand before the judgment seat of God there is no hiding, there is no lying. God is going to lay before us our transgressions and we cannot hide from them. In fact, when this happens, our sins are going to be laid before all to see. Everyone is going to see in full detail the sins of everyone else. It won't be pretty. But we can take on the attitude of David and the woman in our story and humbly admit our fault and ask for forgiveness. This may take a grace from God, but it might be all we have. Outside of love humility is our greatest virtue. Let us always strive to be humble before God.

**I** am sad to announce that we have had 2 separate break-ins of cars in the south parking lot over the past month during Mass times. ### Adult Faith Formation

Evangelization is the primary mission of the Church. Indeed the Church "exists in order to evangelize." (Pope Paul, VI, *On Evangelization in the Modern World #10*) The work of evangelization requires a mature faith assisted by the ongoing work of adult faith formation. Evangelization is not limited to its former meaning of making Christians out of non-Christians. Rather, there is a new understanding of evangelization that is needed in order to enliven the faith of the already baptized and to invite them into a personal dynamic relationship with Jesus Christ in and through the Christian community. (*The Mission of Christ the Redeemer #33*) The General Directory for Catechesis (GDC) and the *National Directory for Catechesis (NDC)* clearly place adult faith formation within the framework of evangelization. Evangelization sets the foundation for adult faith formation. Adult Faith Formation seeks to nurture an encounter with the Lord that leads the believer to a deepening conversion, communion and discipleship. Increasing our love for the Lord will naturally move us to learn more about Him so we can share Him with others.
