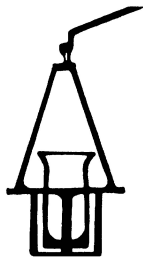

Pastor's Comments

Dear Parishioners,

Happy Fourth of July. Today we hear from the mouth of Jesus the kind of discipleship that is required to follow Him. He sends out the 72 to preach, teach and heal, but when He sends them out He gives them the instruction that they are to take nothing with them for the journey. This takes a great trust in God. They are to take no money bag, no sack, no sandals. All they are to take with them is the Word of God in their hearts. On this occasion of the signing of the Declaration of Independence, Jesus is asking them to be more dependent upon God.

I laugh when I see people in the airport, and I hope I don't come off offending women, but in my estimation it tends to be them more than men, with just so much stuff that they are bringing onto the plane. I wonder where they are going and what is in all those bags. The call to discipleship means leaving all of that stuff behind and placing our total trust in God.

I read a quote once from a woman named Dorothee Soelle where she writes "He who takes the most with him leaves little behind, and therefore remains much the same as he was before, has less chance of finding what he seeks... He who does not give up anything cannot find anything... To find what is sought requires the complete renunciation of this world; compromise brings destruction." I think this quote is so true. If we carry everything that we have with us all the time we are never going to change, or grow. We are just going to go on with the status quo. If we want to change and grow we must learn to let go.

I once saw a movie called DUTCH. In the movie a man goes to pick up a young boy at a boarding school some days drive away. The boy is the son of his girlfriend. The boy is a very selfish, preppy type kid who always has had everything he ever wanted. The man sees this and on the way home they run into some trouble and the man acts like he has lost his wallet. He says to the boy that they are going to have to hitchhike. They stay in a homeless shelter for the night, and have to hitchhike on the back of a truck in the dead of winter. It is a long trip home, but they make it and because of the trip they grow up together. They needed to learn to

depend upon another.

In the gospel today the apostles take nothing with them. They need to learn to depend upon the charity of another. It is very interesting that in sending the disciples out this way that it is not only the disciples who grow here. When the disciples came into town they had nothing and so the people of the town had to take care of them. Maybe that is why Jesus lived the way He did. The disciples could not preach during the day and then check into the Holiday Inn at night. They were forced, if that is the right word, to spend considerable time with the people of the town. They had to be fed and given a place to stay, which forced the people to take an active part in offering hospitality. You see when the disciples came into town with nothing it wasn't just for their sake, but for the people of the town. The people could not just listen to the disciples in their home and then tell them to go home. They were forced to find a bed for them to sleep in. This forced them to become more intimately involved in who the disciples were.

I am reminded of the attitude I see at times even in coming to Mass. Many people arrive late and leave early. They seem more intent on just "getting Mass IN," than really taking ownership of it for themselves. I am also reminded of the many times we offer people to share fellowship after Mass and how few take us up on this. Again, they seem more intent on going to Mass, but not so much in getting to know one another. As Jesus sends His disciples out He is forcing them, and the people they preach to, to get to know one another. There is more to the relationship than just the preaching. In getting to know the disciples the faithful get to know Jesus also not just in the preached word, but in the way the disciples lived their lives. Today I offer a challenge of getting to know Jesus better in and through the fellowship we share with one another.

The Rectory Office will be closed on Monday, July 5 to observe the July 4 holiday. Thank You

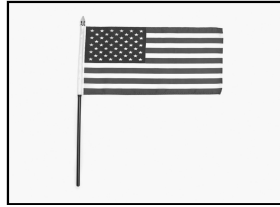


Adult Faith Formation (AFF)
